# DMV CHEATS and TIPS! CHEAT QUESTIONS FOR ALASKA

- 1. Bicyclists have the same rights and responsibilities on the road as drivers of motor vehicles:
- TRUE.
- 2. When entering an interstate or freeway:
- Use the entrance ramp to signal and look for an opening in traffic, adjust your speed to match that of the traffic on the freeway.
- 3. Stop at least \_\_\_\_\_ from the nearest track when the crossing devices are active.
- 15 feet, but not more than 50 feet
- 4. A roundabout is an intersection where:
- Traffic travels around a central island in a counter-clockwise direction.
- 5. When a school bus is flashing its yellow (amber) lights:
- It is about to stop; slow down and prepare to stop.
- 6. You should allow extra room between your vehicle and a motorcycle ahead because:
- Motorcyclists can stop much more quickly than a larger vehicle.
- 7. If a "No Turn On Red" sign is posted:
- You can not make a right hand turn on a red light.
- 8. The Basic Speed Law means:
- You could be cited for driving "too fast for conditions."







#### 9. A green arrow means:

- Go. You must proceed in the direction of the arrow after yielding to pedestrians, bicyclists, and vehicles close enough to be a hazard.
- 10. Always drive on the right side of a two-lane highway except when:
- Passing.
- 11. Red reflectors always mean you are:
- Facing traffic the wrong way and could have a head-on collision.
- 12. If you come upon the victims of a vehicle crash:
- Do not move an injured person who cannot move or complains of pain in the back or neck. Do not attempt to remove the helmet of an injured motorcycle or bicycle rider.
- 13. Parking is not allowed:
- On crosswalks.
- On sidewalks.
- In bicycle lanes.
- · In front of driveways.
- 14. Blind spots around a large truck are known as:
- "No Zones."
- 15. A blind pedestrian can be identified by the use of:
- A guide dog or a white cane (or a white cane with a red tip).
- 16. Always stop for pedestrians:
- At corners with or without traffic lights, whether or not the crosswalks are marked by painted lines.
- 17. Alaska law requires that seat belts be worn by:
- The driver and all passengers.
- 18. Before entering an intersection:
- · Check more than once for motorcyclists.
- 19. When passing, it is against the law to:
- Drive off the paved or main traveled portion of the road or on the shoulder.
- 20. A flashing Red signal light means:
- · Stop. After stopping, you may proceed when it is safe. Observe the right-of-way rules.

- 21. A driver with a Provisional License may not operate a motor vehicle between the hours of:
- 1:00 am and 5:00 am.
- 22. You may pass, if it is safe to do so, when the broken yellow line is:
- On your side of the roadway.
- 23. You must turn on your headlights:
- · Whenever you are driving in rain, fog, or smoke.
- 24. What is the fastest way to sober up after drinking?
- Time is the only thing that will get alcohol out of your system. Coffee and cold showers do not work;
   the alcohol has to be burned off by the liver and the amount of time that takes is different for everyone.
- 25. Before entering a roundabout, drivers must:
- Yield to pedestrians and traffic already in the roundabout.
- 26. Traffic lanes going in the same direction, such as on one-way streets are marked by a:
- · Solid or broken white line.
- 27. A driver with a Provisional License:
- May not transport any passengers.
- 28. When police, fire, or other emergency vehicles approach drivers should:
- · Pull over to the closest edge of the roadway immediately and stop until the emergency vehicle has passed.
- 29. The Basic Speed Law means:
- You may never legally drive faster than the posted speed limit, even if you think it is safe to do so.
- 30. If there is a conflict between the signal light and the directions of a police officer:
- · Obey the police officer not the light.
- 31. At intersections without "STOP" or "YIELD" signs:
- Slow down and be ready to stop. Yield to traffic and pedestrians already in the intersection or just entering the intersection.

### 32. To avoid tailgating:

Use the 4 -second rule. When the vehicle ahead of you passes a certain point such as a sign, count
 "one-thousand-one, one- thousand two, one-thousand-three, one-thousand-four." If you get to the same
 spot before you finish counting, you are following too close.

### 33. U-turns are illegal:

- At or on a railroad crossing.
- On a divided highway by crossing a dividing section, curb, strip of land, or two sets of double yellow lines.
- · Where you cannot see clearly 200 feet in each direction because of a curve, hill, rain, fog, or other reason.
- Where a "No U-Turn" sign is posted.
- When other vehicles may hit you.
- On a one-way street.
- In front of a fire station. Never use a fire station driveway to turn your vehicle around.
- 34. You can receive a ticket for driving too slowly.

- 35. Drivers must always yield the right-of-way to:
- · Persons who are blind.
- 36. The center of a road used for two-way traffic is marked with a:
- Solid or broken yellow line.
- 37. It is illegal for anyone over the age of 21 to drive with a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) of \_\_\_\_\_ or higher

- 38. When passing another vehicle, do not return to the right side of the road until:
- · You can see the headlights/tires of the vehicle you just passed in your rearview mirror.
- 39. Between the hours of sunset and sunrise:
- Use your headlights. Never drive with parking lights alone.
- 40. Under Alaska law, a driver under the age of 21 can be charged with DUI if tests show a Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) of:
- · Any amount.
- 41. Medications taken together or used with \_\_\_\_\_ can be dangerous.
- Alcohol



- 42. If you need to stop after crossing railroad tracks:
- Wait until you can completely cross the tracks before proceeding. Make sure your vehicle clears the tracks before you stop.
- 43. If you refuse to submit to a test for drugs or alcohol:
- · Your driving privileges will be automatically suspended for 90 days.
- 44. A yellow arrow means:
- The protected turning time is ending. Be prepared to obey the next light (red or green).
- 45. At a four-way stop, if more than one vehicle reaches the intersection at the same time:
- The driver on the left should yield to the driver on the right.
- 46. You may pass, if it is safe to do so, when the roadway is marked with a:
- · Broken yellow line.
- 47. If your vehicle starts to skid:
- Take your foot off the gas.
- Do not apply the brakes.
- · Steer in the direction of the skid then steer in the direction you want the car to go.
- 48. When driving in rain or fog:
- Use your low beams only and never drive with parking lights only.
- 49. Unless otherwise posted, the maximum speed limit on most roads and highways is:
- 55 mph.
