# MVD CHEATS and TIPS! CHEAT QUESTIONS FOR NEW MEXICO

- 1. When turning, you should use your turn signal at least:
- 100 feet before the turn.
- 2. The Basic Speed Law means :
- you could be cited for driving "too fast for conditions."
- 3. It is especially difficult to gauge the speed of a motorcycle because:
- They may appear to be much farther away than they really are.
- 4. You may not pass if:
- The solid yellow line is on your side.
- 5. Traffic lanes going in the same direction, such as on one-way streets are marked by a:
- · Solid or broken white line.
- 6. When exiting a freeway or interstate:
- Give yourself plenty of time to move over to the exit lane and signal your intentions well in advance.
- 7. Before changing lanes, signal, look in all your mirrors, and:
- Check traffic behind and beside you.
- Glance over your left or right shoulder to make sure the lane you want is clear.
- Look for all vehicles, motorcyclists, and bicycle traffic in your blind spot.
- Be sure there is enough room for your vehicle in the next lane.
