DOL CHEATS and TIPS! CHEAT QUESTIONS FOR WASHINGTON

- 1. When passing, it is against the law to:
- Drive off the paved or main traveled portion of the road or on the shoulder.
- 2. For the first six months after receipt of an intermediate license, a driver may not transport more than ______ passenger/s.

- 3. When a pedestrian is crossing a public street or highway and the pedestrian is using a walker, a crutch, or an orthopedic cane or wheelchair:
- All vehicles must come to a complete stop.
- 4. In Washington, the use of a cell phone or other wireless communication device while driving is prohibited for:
- The holder of an instruction permit or an intermediate license.
- 5. When a pedestrian is crossing a street or highway guided by a dog or carrying a white cane (or a white cane with a red tip):
- All vehicles must come to a complete stop.
- 6. When entering an interstate or freeway:
- Use the entrance ramp to signal and look for an opening in traffic, adjust your speed to match that of the traffic on the freeway.
- 7. When stopped for a school bus with its red lights flashing and its stop arm extended, you may not proceed until:
- The bus driver has turned off the flashing red lights and withdrawn the stop arm.
- 8. You may pass, if it is safe to do so, when the broken yellow line is:
- On your side of the roadway.









- 9. To avoid tailgating, keep a distance of at least ______ between you and the vehicle ahead:
- 2 to 3 seconds; 4 at higher speeds. When the vehicle ahead of you passes a certain point such as a sign, count "one-thousand-one, one- thousand two,... etc." If you get to the same spot before you finish counting, you are following too close.
- 10. When two cars enter an intersection without traffic control signs or signals:
 - The driver on the left yields to the driver on the right.
- 11. When parking either uphill or downhill without a curb:
- Turn the wheels so the vehicle will roll away from the center of the road if the brakes fail.
- 12. Unless otherwise posted, the maximum speed limit in a school zone is:
- 20 mph.
- 13. If your brakes get wet and start to pull to one side:
- Slow down and gently pump the brakes until they start to work correctly.
- 14. If another driver does not dim his/her lights:
- Do not look directly into the oncoming headlights.
- Look toward the right edge of your lane.
- · Watch the oncoming vehicle out of the corner of your eye.
- 15. When police, fire, or other emergency vehicles approach drivers should:
- Pull over to the closest edge of the roadway immediately and stop until the emergency vehicle has passed.
- 16. Alcohol impairs your:
- Judgment.
- 17. A red signal light means:
- · Stop.
- 18. If the road has four or more lanes with two-way traffic, drive in:
- The right lanes except when overtaking and passing.

- 32. Before entering a roundabout, drivers must
- Yield to pedestrians and traffic already in the roundabout.
- 33. Do not attempt to pass unless:
- You are sure there is enough clear space ahead to complete the pass safely.
- 34. If you are driving slowly on a two-lane highway or road where passing is unsafe, and five or more vehicles are following you:
- Drive into the turnout areas or lanes to let the vehicles pass.
- 35. You should allow extra room between your vehicle and a motorcycle ahead because:
 - Motorcyclists can stop much more quickly than a larger vehicle.
- 36. If you need to stop after crossing railroad tracks:
- Wait until you can completely cross the tracks before proceeding. Make sure your vehicle clears the tracks before you stop.
- 37. The safest speed is:
- One that allows you to have complete control of your vehicle and avoid collisions with other vehicles and pedestrians.
- 38. If you come upon the victims of a vehicle crash:
 - Do not move an injured person who cannot move or complains of pain in the back or neck. Do not attempt to remove the helmet of an injured motorcycle or bicycle rider.
- 39. When passing another vehicle, do not return to the right side of the road until:
- You can see the headlights/tires of the vehicle you just passed in your rearview mirror.
- 40. When turning, you should use your turn signal at least:
- 100 feet before the turn.
- 41. When exiting a freeway or interstate:
- Give yourself plenty of time to move over to the exit lane and signal your intentions well in advance.



- 42. Following a truck too closely is dangerous because:
- The trucker can't see you and, if he applies his brakes, you could crash into him.
- 43. Unless otherwise posted, the maximum speed limit on state highways is:
